Two-year or four-year institutions that are regulated in part by the State.	An institution offering education and training beyond high school. This office processes students' applications for admission.
Non-profit organizations not funded by State funds.	The undergraduate degree awarded by colleges and universities upon completion of a course of study lasting three to seven years.	Most Iowa colleges and universities will accept scores from these tests.	Requesting this allows a student to apply to college without paying an application fee.
Businesses providing education as their product or service.	Money provided to help a student pay for college.	The "Students — Tips for Success" section of this website offers tips to rock a college visit and more.	Experts recommend that students apply to at least this many schools or programs.
These colleges offer programs in three major areas of instruction – adult education, career programs of vocational and technical education and college parallel.
